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## **Linn County Rural Land Use Plan Update**

- Current plan adopted in 2000.
- Plan Implementation chapter calls for an in-depth review of the Plan every 5 years to determine:
  - Progress in implementing the plan;
  - Changes in community needs or other conditions that form the basis of the plan;
  - Fiscal condition of the County;
  - Community support of the Plan's Goals and Objectives



#### **Iowa Smart Planning Bill**

Passed during the 2010 legislative session, Senate File 2389 established ten smart planning principles.

- Four primary components of the bill:
  - 1. Iowa Smart Planning Principles
  - Local Comprehensive Planning Guidance (Plan Elements)
  - 3. Iowa Smart Planning Task Force
  - 4. \$30 Million Disaster Mitigation Grant Program

## **Local Comprehensive Planning Grant Program**

- Linn County estimated the cost of the plan update at \$77,000.
- Received a grant award through the Local Comprehensive Planning Grant Program for \$38,490.
- The grant expectations state that, "Recipients shall develop plans that meaningfully apply and integrate each of the ten Smart Planning Principles strategically where appropriate within the 13 elements of the plan."
- Linn County will complete the plan update using the legislation as a guide.

### **Public Participation Plan**

- Drafted a Public Participation Plan to provide direction during the planning process.
  - The plan outlines 12 different public participation strategies (including facebook, focus groups, surveys, etc).
  - Each strategy has goals, objectives, and activities.
- The following example falls under the "Public Events" strategy.

#### **Public Participation Plan**

#### **Goal of Public Events Strategy:**

Provide information to and receive information from the public.

#### **Objectives**:

- Generate interest around the RLUP update among stakeholders.
- Attract and identify potential committee members.
- Gather input to determine level of interest in each plan element.
- Identify potential conflicts between potential stakeholder groups and surrounding jurisdictions.
- Identify projects where collaboration between jurisdictions and stakeholder groups are possible.









## **Public Events Display Booth Items**
